## Volunteer Recognition from RCMP

**Reminder** – if you have not entered the start date that you joined your local Citizens On Patrol group on the ACOPA website, please do so right away. This information is used to determine who will receive recognition from the RCMP for volunteering with C.O.P. for 5, 10, 15, 20 25, years of service. ACOPA Liaison Officer Elizabeth Vandaelle will be making the presentations at the ACOPA Workshop in September. A start date is also a requirement to getting an ACOPA ID card.

## STATISTICS TO ADD TO ACOPA WEBSITE

**Reminder** – To group administrators, please get the statistics for your group entered into the website including the number of kilometers driven on patrols, the number of volunteer hours patrolling, the number of hours for community special events and the number of hours for administration meetings.

For the new groups, to figure out the total number of hours for a patrol, if 2 people patrol for 4 hours, that equals 8 hours of volunteer time. Kilometers is the number of kilometers for the patrol. For a meeting, whether for the board or a patrollers meeting, if the meeting is 2 hours and there are 10 volunteers at the meeting, that equals 20 hours to enter for meetings.

The ACOPA Webmaster shares a report at the Workshop for the totals entered from all the groups. These numbers are important to show both the RCMP and the Alberta government what the members are doing. Please have your stats entered by August 15<sup>th</sup>.

## Criminal Record Checks

**Reminder** – several volunteers will need to update their Criminal Record Checks. The RCMP has mandated that the CRC's must be updated every 2 years. The group administrator enters the date on the ACOPA website for each volunteer. If the CRC is not updated before the expiry date, the volunteer will be blocked from entering the website, so it is important to keep the CRC up to date.
