#### Statement of Intent

It is time to add the topic of "Statement of Intent" to your meeting agenda.

For those who are new to ACOPA, Jubilee Insurance has provided a 5% reduction in the Liaibility Insurance rate if a COP group signs the "Statement of Intent" and returns to the ACOPA Insurance volunteer at insurance@acopa.ca before Sept 1, 2015.

<u>This form must be signed every year in order to receive the reduced rate</u>. Members change so it is important to discuss and make members aware of this opportunity to save a few dollars.

What this means is that your group agrees to follow the A.C.O.P.A. Reference Manual to the best of their ability while acting as a C.O.P. volunteer. In other words, if your group has not had any training, or has not opened the A.C.O.P.A. Reference Manual nor reviewed or studied the suggestions offered, then your group need not apply for the 5% reduction in the Liability Insurance rate.

Jubilee Insurance has assured ACOPA that "coverage would extend as long as you are on duty as a COP.". Permission has been approved from "K" Division for Flagger training. The training is to provide more information to assist C.O.P. members in their duties. Keep in mind that this is not training for the purpose of directing traffic for the R.C.M.P. For liability reasons, the R.C.M.P. will not ask a C.O.P. member to direct traffic. So, for your own safety, this is training that will keep you alert in the event that you come upon an accident, or are assisting with a community event.
